Concerned with diverse, difficult situations after surgery on the pancreas, patients had the idea to found a working group in Heidelberg. That was in 1976. Precisely at the same time, people also came together to raise awareness and to solve life-threatening problems - the idea of "self-help" was born. Since 1976, doctors and nutritionists have worked with the AdP. The organization supports the rehabilitation of patients, suffering from pancreatic disease (operation or illness of the pancreas itself). But particularly, the AdP supports patients with pancreatic cancer. With over 1,300 active members and more than 60 groups in Germany, the AdP raises significant awareness about pancreatic cancer. Every year, more than 16,500 cases of pancreatic cancer are diagnosed in Germany. The organization estimates more than 65,000 incidences of chronic pancreatic inflammation in the country as well. The AdP is a non-profit organization that has developed a well-functioning system of aid for the disease since 1979, with the support of doctors from different disciplines: nutritionists, psychologists and social experts. My Everest Association was founded in Rivolta D'Adda (CR) in October 2015 by Monica Rozzoni, Luca and Chiara Sala, wife and sons of Luigi Sala, who was the founder of "My Everest Project." He died from pancreatic cancer at the age of 46. "My Everest Project" was an initiative aimed at people suffering from pancreatic cancer: The name comes from the passion that Luigi had for the mountains. His first goal had been to raise 8,848 euros to support pancreatic cancer research at the San Raffaele Hospital in Milan, virtually climbing 1 meter/euro of the highest mountain in the world - Mount Everest. Luigi climbed other mountains when he was sick to demonstrate that when you have cancer you can do a lot of incredible things, even climb mountains never climbed before. He demonstrated that the best way to face the illness was to be positive and trust in medicine.

Luigi knew that this cancer is still not well-known to scientific research because its symptoms are silent and it is possible to diagnose it only in advanced stages. For this reason, he decided to raise funds for clinical trials. Today, the project is focused on providing information on current clinical trials and on prevention via its website and, of course, on raising funds for research.




